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This pamphlet is intended only for those whose names appear in it. The information has been wholly obtained by correspondence, and it is not at all improbable that errors may appear. If any are noticed, I should be glad to have them pointed out. Much, and in fact, nearly all of the information with reference to the earlier generations of the family, has been obtained from aged people, who will soon pass away. It has been my object to gather up and preserve what they knew, while it was available. I am principally indebted to Mr. Elibu Dickerman, of North Haven, Connecticut, for my information, in regard to the first four generations of the family, and to my Aunt, Mrs. Esther Gates, for information about the fifth generation. Also to Miss Harriet E. Dickerman, of Brattleboro, Vermont, for information with regard to people by the name of Dickerman, in that State. For information about the families of the later generations, some one or more of each family know that I have annoyed them not a little. In addition to this I have corresponded largely with other parties in Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut and Ohio. While there has been a good deal of labor connected with the undertaking, still, I think the respect which the descendants of John Dickerman, of the fifth generation, entertain for him and his wife, and the pride they all feel in the family name, warrants the attempt.

THOMAS DICKERMAN,

Came from England in 1635, and settled in Dorchester, Massachusetts. The time and place of his birth are not known. He was married after his arrival at Dorchester, to a woman whose christian name was Ellen, but whose maiden name in full is not known. He died at Dorchester in 1657, leaving two children, and after his death his widow married John Ballard, of Medfield, Massachusetts. This is all that is known of the man from whom all the people of that name, in this country, are probably descended. After his death his son Abram went to New Haven, and lived there until the time of his death.

My reasons for thinking that Thomas Dickerman is the common ancestor of all the people by the name of Dickerman, in this country, and especially for thinking that John Dickerman, of the fifth generation, as here-in-after arranged, was a descendant of his, are as follows:

Learning incidentally of the existence of several people of that name in the vicinity of New Haven, Connecticut, I commenced a correspondence with Mr. Elihu Dickerman, of North Haven, who very promptly gave me what statistics he had in his possession. These were not arranged so fully as will be hereafter found, but I was at once struck with the similarity of names, and also saw at a glance that New Haven, the adopted home of Abram Dickerman, of the second generation, was the starting place of all the Dickermans. It was a known fact that John Dickerman, of the fifth generation, went there from Brattleboro, Vermont, to learn his trade. What more natural way to account for his going there, than to conclude that he had relatives there? Again, by examining the disjointed records sent me by Mr. Elihu Dickerman, I found that Abram, of the third generation, had a son by the name of John who married Esther Sperry, and who having left New Haven, was supposed to have settled in Vermont. About this time I wrote to my Aunt, Mrs. Esther Gates, and asked her if she knew the names of her father's parents. Without knowing anything about the

information I was possessed of, she at once replied that his father's name was John and his mother's name was Esther, and that her full maiden name was Esther Sperry. The coincidence, to my mind, was conclusive that there was an undoubted connection, and I entertain no doubt now of the fact. I have examined carefully and written several times to try and get the record of the fourth generation more complete, but the materials are not at hand. I think it not improbable that there may have been more children of that generation, but I have not been able to discover more. What there is known about these first four generations is preserved, for the most part, in records; but they are disjointed and very unsatisfactory in point of arrangement, and one has to be governed largely by the consecutive and natural order of dates in arranging the generations. In this particular I have departed somewhat from the opinions entertained by my informant, some of his dates and arrangements leading to manifest inconsistencies. Something has also been handed down by way of tradition, in reference to these first four generations, which seems to have been preserved by their descendants at New Haven. I have endeavored only to trace the line of connection down to my branch of the family. Mr. Elihu Dickerman, of North Haven, born in 1802, has four children and six grand-children. A brother Enos, born in 1800, and living near him, has three sons and six or eight grand-children. Another brother, Lebeus, born in 1803 and also living near him, has four children, three of whom are married, but no grand-children. Elihu also had two sisters, one of whom is still living. His father's name was Enos—born in 1775, and died in 1854. His grandfather's name was also Enos; born in 1743 and died in 1778. He was taken prisoner by the British, in New York, and died there. His great-grandfather's name was Jonathan; born in 1719 and died in 1792. He was probably the son of some one of the third generation.

Mr. John Dickerman, of Brattleboro, Vermont, is a physician. His father's name was John Locke Dickerman, and he was a physician. His father's name was Lemuel and he was also a physician. His father's name was John but his occupation is not known.

In different parts of New York, Massachusetts, Connecticut and Ohio, I have learned of other people by the same name, and I have no doubt but that if records could be obtained, they would all

point to New Haven and Thomas Dickerman, for a starting point. I confine myself to John Dickerman, of the fifth generation, and style his family the Guilford Branch, to avoid confusion, and because he settled in Guilford, Chenango County, New York. There six of his children were born. There, or near there, a large proportion of the births, marriages and deaths in his family have occurred, and near there he and his wife, with many of their descendants, lie buried.

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(1) JOHN DICKERMAN,

The first of the Guilford Branch of the Dickerman Family, and the fifth of the last generation, was born March 17, 1764, in Vermont, but the precise place is not known. While a young man he went to New Haven and worked four years, learning the blacksmith trade. He then returned to Brattleboro, Vermont, and remained there working at his trade until about the year 1800, when he moved to Guilford, Chenango County, New York. He was married in the year 1789 (precise time not known), to Thankful Smith. At the age of sixteen he enlisted as a soldier in the Revolutionary War, and fought nine months. During the latter part of his service he was employed as a scout, being accounted the hardest and fleetest man in his division. In his life-time he often spoke of Ethan Allen, and he probably served with the famous Green Mountain Boys. For several years previous to his death, he drew a pension of thirty-six dollars a year, and after his death his widow drew the same amount so long as she lived. He died at his son-in-law's, William C. Sliters, near Rockdale, in the town of Unadilla, Otsego County, New York, November 6, 1848.

He was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and for several years previous to his death was quite deaf. Mingling the occupation of blacksmith and farmer, he fulfilled the Scriptural injunction of earning his living by the sweat of his brow. He raised a large family, giving them such education as was within his power and means, and sent them forth to struggle with the world with the best of instruction, and an example to pattern after which was every way worthy their attention and study.

He was simple and abstemious in his habits; frugal and careful of his time and property; faithful and diligent in his labor and pursuits. He was also a man of candor and great integrity of purpose. No politician, no disseminator of feuds. He minded his own business, and as a citizen sought to act his part and vote understandingly. Farther than this he had no secular ambition. He lived the life of a most consistent christian, and left to his descendants a character—not brilliant, nor discolored here and there by dark spots, but substantial, simple, even, and so well rounded

into completeness, that they will do no better than to adopt it as a model.

John Dickerman is a good representative of the whole family. As a general rule, they are farmers and laboring men. Those of his descendants who follow merchandise or any other business for a pursuit, must have acquired the taste from their other ancestors. Few of the Dickermans, proper, are wealthy, while as a general thing they are in comfortable circumstances. They are too honest and too little given to speculation to amass wealth. Extraordinary wealth, as a general thing, is only acquired by men in whom generosity, philanthropy, and the cardinal virtues are more or less wanting. Nor is the fact that a man is very wealthy, the surest index of his integrity and purity of character. The Dickermans are a class of men who mind their own business, cause no disturbances in community, have no law-suits, encourage and sustain our schools and public institutions, revere and cherish our common country, honor and obey the precepts and teachings of the Holy Bible.

In the time of the Revolutionary War the earlier generations of the family were largely represented in the army, and in looking over their names, the titles, Colonel, Major, Captain, Lieutenant and Ensign, are frequent. So in the late war; the family, by its different branches, was largely represented in the army. They acquire a good practical education, study and understand the institutions of our country; are men of good judgement and good common sense. They are not men who are ambitious to acquire a little short lived popularity in politics or otherwise. They resort to no trickery or mean devices to accomplish any end. They educate their children and send them forth with a good character for a pattern, and good instruction for a guide.

(2) THANKFUL SMITH

Was born April 7, 1768, probably at Granby, Massachusetts, but the precise place is not known. Her father's name was Seth Smith and her mother's first name Thankful, the same as her own. Her father had two wives and fifteen children. The following statement, though somewhat imperfect, shows the pedigree of her family as far as it can be traced:

Seth Smith, senior, was a Colonel of militia in the Revolutionary War. When the news first reached his town of the invasion of the British, he was in church on Sunday. He instantly left the house, mounted his horse and rode all over the town raising volunteers. The next morning, with his newly raised recruits, he marched about thirty miles and arrived in time to participate in the battle of Bennington. His residence was Granby, Massachusetts.

Israel Smith—a brother of Seth Smith—had eight or nine children. The name of the oldest was Chloë Smith. She married a man by the name of Hayes, of Brattleboro, Vermont. They had

seven or eight children. The fifth was Rutherford Hayes, and he was the father of Rutherford B. Hayes, the present Governor of the State of Ohio.

Thankful Smith often spoke of her father's connection with the Revolutionary army, and though a young girl, remembered the battle of Bennington and spoke of it frequently. In her life she was genial, lively and open-hearted; active, and really a help-meet in the raising of their large family. She lived to lose her recollection and for several of the last years of her life, though a mere child, she still retained in a most remarkable degree, her health and physical vigor. At the age of eighty and upwards she was as active and quick as a young girl of fifteen. While she hardly remembered what occurred in the later years of her life so long as she was talking about them, she did evidently recall the incidents of her girlhood years with accuracy. The writer recalls one instance in particular, when he called upon her after she was eighty years of age. She neither knew him, nor when told who he was, did she seem to remember it for more than a minute; it was a mere flash, and lost. However, upon leaving the room—evidently associating him with his father, who was one of her oldest children, and born in Brattleboro, Vermont—she remarked that she wished him to call upon her in her room, as she desired to inquire of him about the Brattleboro folks. Soon after, in company with a cousin, he went into her room and as soon as she had made the necessary disposition of chairs, &c., for welcome, she commenced asking questions about Deacon this and Doctor that, wishing to know if they lived by the church or over the creek where they used to, and a thousand other questions of a like nature. He, as well as his cousin, told her that he had never been to Brattleboro and knew nothing about the people. She insisted that he did and must, and to gratify her he finally answered at random, yes and no, to her numerous questions. She manifested much interest and at the close of the conversation, remarked that she was glad to hear from old Brattleboro once more. Her manner was perfectly natural; her questions were put naturally, and her informant has no doubt, to this day, but what she asked him about the people who lived in Brattleboro when she lived there. She was a kind mother and greatly beloved by children. She died, October 7, 1856, at the residence of her son-in-law, William C. Sliter, near Rockdale, in the Town of Unadilla, Otsego County, New York. With her husband she was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and a most exemplary christian.
